Rules ENV-Sw308: General Permit Rules for Categories of Solid Waste Facilities:

Tara Albert gave a Briefing on the changes to ENV-Sw308.

Division Activities & Legislative Update:

Director Michael Wimsatt gave an update on filling the vacant positions in the Solid Waste Bureau. We hired Todd Moore to fill the Administrator III position. Jamie Colby has accepted the CEV position Jamie came to us from Sanborn Head. Tara Albert has been hired as our SWOT coordinator.

Todd, Jamie and Paul have all been able to travel to Wisconsin to attend the Landfill design course.

Erin Holmes has also accepted the CEIV position in ORCB Erin also comes to us from Sanborn & Head. LeaAnne Atwell also comes from Sanborn Head and is working in the HWRB filling the vacant Hydrogeologist III she is currently working on Saint Gobain project. There will be three upcoming retirements. Jack Chwasciak runs the Safe tank program. Jack has worked at DES for 37 years. John Liptak, who worked in Outreach for the HWRB and Susan Francesco who was our Hazardous Waste Coordinator and headed up the Toastmaster's Program here at DES.

Mr. Wimsatt gave a brief synopsis of the issues regarding PFOA's at the Saint Gobain facilities There is one in Hoosick Falls NY and North Bennington Vermont. The Hoosick Falls Public Water Supply has contamination with PFOA's at 400 parts per trillion EPA is working on a lifetime standard for PFOA. New York & Maine have set preliminary standards at 100 parts per trillion and Vermont has set its standards at 20 Parts per trillion.

Mr. Wimsatt also gave a briefing on the upcoming legislation, HB-1171 Is just some housekeeping for Oil Programs.

SB 380 Drinking water trust fund from the MTBE Law suit has 81 million dollars. Exxon did not settle the 236 million dollar Verdict. State Supreme Court upheld the Verdict and Exxon Mobil will file in Federal Court. If the Federal Court does not except the Appeal 236 million plus interest would be deposited into the Trust Fund.

HB 1200-L Relative to the use of recycled glass, the use of recycled glass in construction projects.

HB 1298 the dumping of solid waste in which there is damage to private property
